### Local Golf Course Rules:

- Please play a set of tees that matches your handicap.
- Cars must stay on the paths on all Par 3's.
- St. John's Golf & Country Club is a non-metal spike facility.
- Proper golf attire is required at all times.
- Personal coolers are not permitted.
- Golfers are not permitted in environmentally sensitive areas.
- Golfers must have a valid drivers license to operate a golf car.

### USGA Rules of Golf govern all play except when modified by local rules

- Lateral Water Hazards - Defined by red stakes and/or lines
- Water Hazards - Defined by yellow stakes and/or lines
- Out of Bounds - Defined by white stakes, any fences, inside edge of perimeter roadways and property lines.

PLEASE! Keep golf cars 50 yards from greens, fill divots, rake bunkers and repair ball marks on green.

1  
Par 4

Straight away with natural areas on right and left. Steer clear of the large Oak and sand bunkers on the left and you'll have an easy approach to a large green.



2  
Par 5

A broad-shouldered par 5 with a slight dogleg to the left. A fairway bunker on the right is reachable from the tee followed by water all the way to the green. Mounding on the left frames the hole. Sand and grass bunkers guard the green.



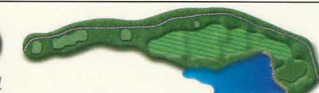
3  
Par 3

Beautiful par 3 with water bordering the right side. Sand bunker on the right and grass collection area on the left will receive a lot of action.



4  
Par 4

The shortest par 4. Very scenic with reachable water off the tee on the right side. Mounding on the left and a bulkhead green complex. Take a little more club to be sure.



5  
Par 3

A par 3 with a large sand bunker that wraps around the entire right side of the green. The lack of depth perception makes this hole more difficult than it looks. Trust the yardage.



6  
Par 4

A difficult par 4 with water on both sides and a deep natural furrow crossing just beyond the tees. Sand bunkers line the right side of the hole. A small green falls off to the back. Par is a great score.



7  
Par 4

This hole has water on the right and a sand waste bunker on the left off the tee. There is water to the left of this undulated green.



8  
Par 5

A waste area down the left and sand bunkers on both sides frame the hole. A mound across the fairway with sand bunkers on either side appears to be green side, but in fact, creates a false front. The green is 40 yards further. A sloping green is also well bunkered.



9  
Par 4

Water on the left and a lot of sand on the right. Mounding and sand surround the large, long green. A north wind spells trouble on this hole. Enjoy the spectacular view of the clubhouse.
